Application Process

Students must first apply and be accepted into the Trulaske College of Business at MU. Students who meet the ACT/SAT and class rank qualifications receive an invitation by mail to apply.

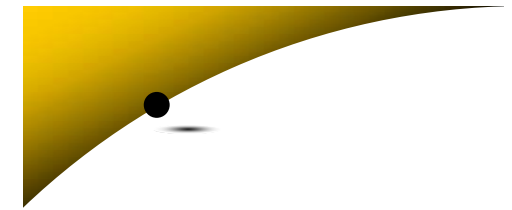
about the college

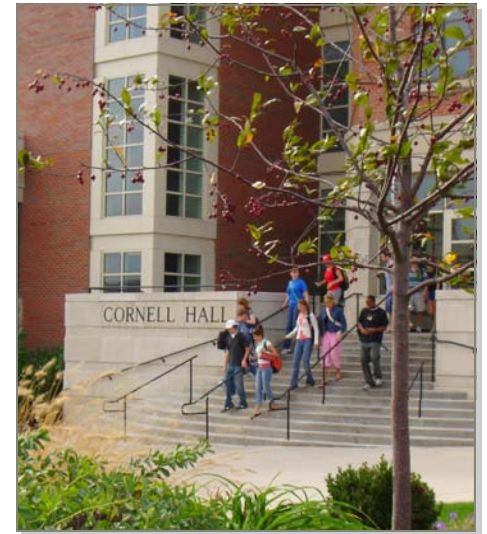

The Robert J. Trulaske, Sr. College of Business is proud to announce the establishment of the Harry and Ann Cornell Leadership Program (CLP) to develop leaders in business. Students admitted into this highly selective program will be involved in a series of honors-type experiences and extracurricular activities aimed at developing leadership competencies.

Students will be actively engaged from their first day on campus through a specially designed program that will take them beyond the traditional classroom experience. Corporate visits will allow students to interact with business people early on in their academic career and the lecture series will further enhance student learning.

As a Cornell Leader, you will have the opportunity to develop a close relationship with a faculty member and be mentored by alumni who will guide you through your academic career and beyond.

Acceptance into the CLP

- Student applicants complete an essay that discusses leadership experiences and goals
- Competitive: based on essay, academic record, and extracurricular activities
- *Requirements for Incoming Freshmen*
 - * 28 ACT or 1860 SAT
 - * Graduate in top 15% of High School Class
 - * Application including previous leadership experience, essay, and letter of recommendation
- *Requirements for Current Business Students* —Students who do not get in, or do not apply, to the Cornell Leadership Program as a Freshman will have an opportunity the semester in which they have been admitted to an Upper Level Emphasis area to apply for the program.
 - * 3.25 UM system GPA
 - * At least 15 credit hours earned at MU
 - * Application including previous leadership experience, essay, and letter of recommendation

- Priority acceptance into Trulaske College of Business honors classes
