Study Abroad in Alicante, Spain Summer Business Program

Depart Thursday, June 25 - Arrive June 26 - Return July 24, 2020

1. Highlights

- A. Study in beautiful Alicante for four weeks on the Costa Blanca
- B. All courses and program activities are conducted in English
- C. Earn six credit hours

2. General Requirements for Program Participation

- A. You must be 18 or older.
- B. You must be in good academic standing and have no current disciplinary sanctions.
- C. You will need a passport that is valid for at least six months after your scheduled return date.
- D. You will be asked to sign a liability release form and a medical release form (included in the International Center's orientation materials).
- E. You must meet minimum health insurance requirements set by the university.
- F. You must attend all of the Trulaske College of Business's pre-departure class meetings.
- G. You will be expected to fully complete the application and International Center safety and security orientation through MyStudyAbroad.
- H. Participants must agree to the terms expressed in the MU student conduct manual and the MU "Conditions of Participation and Program Acceptance" form.

3. Program Details

A. Program beginning and end

The program begins when you check in at the Villa Universitaria on June 26 and ends when you check out on or before noon on July 24, 2020.

B. Location

The courses will be conducted at the University of Alicante, located on the southeastern coast of Spain, four hours by train from Barcelona (northeast corner of Spain). Alicante lies on the Costa Blanca (*White* Coast) portion of the sandy beaches along Spain's east side on the Mediterranean Sea on a coastline over 200 kilometers long.

Alicante has a large boulevard lined with beautiful palm trees, many shopping streets and tapas cafes. The weather is excellent all year round and the scenic island of Tabarca is only a short trip by sea. Alicante has a population of about 310,000 inhabitants but has a small and intimate feeling. It contains many old buildings; beautiful architecture, and hosts numerous nice restaurants, shops and walking paths.

C. Lodging and Meals

During your program in Alicante, you will be a 5 to7-minute walk across the street from campus in the Villa Universitaria and you have your own room and bath. The Villa has a beautiful swimming pool, internet access in the rooms, and laundry facilities in the building. The Cafeteria is located adjacent to the building, providing easy

access for meals. <u>Three meals per day at the Villa are included at no extra cost.</u> Also, three or four dinner events are included as part of the social and cultural activities in this program. The new Metra allows for easy and flexible access from campus to the center of Alicante (old town and La Puerta de Alicante) and its beautiful beaches.

D. Language and Culture

The culture of Spain is rich with history and art. Learning about the culture, customs and lifestyles, as well as some elements of the language can allow for more appreciation and understanding of how the local people view and enjoy life (food, politics, history, culture, fashion, and travel). Some elementary language will be introduced throughout the pre-departure class sessions.

4. Course Offerings and Prerequisites

The University of Missouri (MU) and the University of Alicante (AU) will both offer two courses (6 credits) in International business. The courses will satisfy BSBA graduation requirements for MU business students. Only one will count for **emphasis** and the other as **emphasis support**.

Business Minors: Only one course will count for the business minor. You should plan the other course to fulfill a requirement in your major or as a general elective. **All Students, including Non-Business majors, should check with their academic advisor on how these credits can be applied to their graduation requirements.** All hours are MU summer school credit hours.

Classes will be limited to approximately 20 MU students, with <u>first preference given to students who are seniors</u> <u>and majoring in the particular topic</u>. You should plan to **discuss these courses** and this study abroad program **with your advisor** to clarify exactly how these courses will satisfy the graduation requirements for your particular major or emphasis area.

Pre-departure Classes at MU

Prior to the start of the program, pre-departure class sessions will be held in Cornell Hall, beginning in April. The purpose of these class meetings will be to provide lectures on the principles of international business, review information regarding the companies that will be visited and orientation to the host country, travel administration, and safety abroad.

This is a **non-credit course** for which you will be required to **register before the first day of the predeparture class**, in order to go on the program. <u>You will not be charged any educational fees for this</u> <u>"course"</u>. When registering – <u>search in "additional criteria" for the **Class Number only**.</u>

NOTE: It is a <u>requirement</u> of this program that you attend all of these class sessions to prepare for your program. You <u>must attend all</u> of the classes or you will not be allowed to participate in this program. Possible special circumstances may allow flexibility on this requirement but would have to be approved by the program director prior to missing the class. **If you are dropped from the program because of non-attendance – you will be subject to the penalties listed in section 11 of this document.**

5. Program Schedule: this is a draft current as of November 19, 2019. Details may change.

This program is conducted in cooperation with the University of Alicante Rafael Altamira program. The first week is a planned program of educational activities that will combine the MU and Erasmus students in the Rafael Altamira program in Alicante. It will include Spanish culture presentations and activities, and company visits. The academic courses will be conducted with MU and Spanish/Erasmus students learning and studying together during the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th weeks.

• Company Visits

We have planned for you to visit many interesting and varied companies whose high-level managers may discuss some of their business strategies with you. These visits are subject to the availability to schedule and subject to company cancellations at the last minute.

6. Students Walking for Graduation in May

Due to the departure date, this issue does not apply to this program.

7. Weekend Travel

Long weekends accommodate travel to other destinations during the 4-week program. This travel is at your expense and discretion and <u>class attendance policies will remain in effect upon resumption the next week class</u> <u>sessions.</u>

8. Travel to program site from the U.S.

<u>The program fee does not include round-trip airfare cost from the US to the program site</u>. You must fly on your own or with friends by arranging your own flight itineraries and reservations. <u>The Alicante airport (ALC) will be the final destination for flight planning for this program</u>. During the spring class meetings, you will be assisted with information on program staff flight itineraries and how to book flights for traveling together. We will also explain the process for taking a taxi from the airport to the dormitory, where the student managers will be waiting to greet you and assist you with checking into the dormitory. **Failure to provide a paid ticket itinerary by Apr 28 may result in being dropped from the program**.

9. Estimated Budget

Note: Tuition is <u>estimated as UGR Resident fees</u> and is approximate until the Board of Curators of the University of Missouri sets the new fees in April during the spring semester prior to departure. <u>Non-resident students pay their usual</u> <u>additional non-resident fees</u>. Provided you are taking courses necessary for graduation – this simply shifts tuition costs from one term to another. The costs presented above in the student-planning budget are best estimates within five percent.

Expenses Included in Program Fee:

- A. Lodging for the trip duration (\$1,344)
- B. Meals included in the program fees, as noted on the itinerary (\$1,900-\$2,100)
- C. Culture and company visits and program ground transportation (\$300)
- D. Program expenses (\$153)

- E. MU GeoBlue Health Insurance (\$35)
- F. Weekend trip to Granada and day tour of Tabarca Island (\$350)

Expenses NOT Included in Program Fee:

- A. Round trip transportation from the US to Alicante.
- B. Weekend travel and daily expenses are extra personal expenses by the student, which will depend upon the wants and desires of each student, such as travel destinations, going out with friends, personal items, souvenirs, gifts, etc.
- C. MU tuition for the two summer courses (6 hours) billed to your student account in the spring. Resident students pay usual resident fees. <u>Non-resident students will pay the usual non-resident fees</u>.
- D. Passport, passport renewal or passport application fees.
- E. MU International Center study abroad administrative fee of \$245. This fee covers MU support services for student emergencies during the program period.

11. Withdrawal from Program - Student must contact the Student Services Coordinator directly by e-mail

documenting any withdrawals from the intended study abroad program. Withdrawal date will be determined to be the <u>date shown on the e-mail</u> that is sent to the Student Services Coordinator in 213 Cornell Hall stating intent to withdraw from the program.

*** Depending on the date that you withdraw from the program, the study abroad department may or may not be able to get a refund from the vendor. Your refund will be relative to the costs that can be recovered. If you have not been billed the program fee at the time of your withdrawal – you will be billed for any cancellations fees charged to the program.

12. Visas and Travel Documents

- All students will need a valid US passport or appropriate passport/documentation from their country of citizenship valid for at least 6 months after your return date.
- Non-US citizen students at Mizzou will need to check the Internet about visa requirements for program sites for their particular country of citizenship.
- Copy of all program participant passports due to Study Abroad Office by March 31 to remain on the program. If you are concerned about timing have it expedited.

13. APPLICATION Deadline: <u>March 31</u>. This program does not use a competitive selection process. <u>Students who</u> register after 50 students have submitted their registration forms will be placed on a waiting list and accepted as space permits.

**Application process and procedures: (Students must start the process on the selected program's webpage which is reached via *TrulaskeAbroad.missouri.edu.*)

- Go the web page for the program of interest.
- Click on *Details and Information* link which will take you to that program's information document.
- Read it thoroughly failure to do so will not excuse participants from any requirements or penalties. See section 11 of the information document.
- Once you have decided on which program you would like to attend click on the *"start application"* link in the upper right corner of the page.
- When you begin the application you will show up in the database as "Pending."
- You must hit the "Submit" button to be accepted to the program.
- You will then receive an e-mail from the *myStudyAbroad* database alerting you that you have been "Accepted". (That email will explain the consequences for not following the instructions given in the email. Read it thoroughly failure to do so will not excuse participants from any requirements or penalties.)
- If you are "Accepted" you will be placed on a HOLD LIST.
- To move to the **ACTIVE ROSTER**, go back into your on-line application and change your status from "Accepted" to **"Committed"**. <u>Be sure you are ready to commit as penalties will begin to apply, subject</u> <u>to Section 11 of the program document.</u>
 - All programs have a maximum number of participants who can attend the program, so delays could affect your participation in the program.
 - As others on the HOLD LIST commit to the program, they will move ahead of you onto the ACTIVE ROSTER.
 - Those on the hold list will be notified as spaces become available after the program's max has been reached.
- Once you have changed your status to "Committed", you must return to the on-line application and complete the entire application. Failure to comply could affect your participation in the program.
- If, at any point you decide to withdraw from the program you must notify the Student Services
 <u>Coordinator via TrulaskeAbroad@missouri.edu</u> AND return to your on-line app and change your status
 <u>to "WITHDRAWAL: Declined"</u>. Penalties are determined by the date that you complete these 2 steps.
